### Women's Evening Discussion Group meets Tuesday, Dec. 10, at 6 p.m. at the Fellowship in the Dr. Cline Room


All are invited to attend this discussion. No food is served. New members welcome. Contact Natalia Graf-Jones, for more information.

- AN IMPORTANT NEW BOOK: "AGAINST: What Does the White Evangelical Want?" by Tad Delay, Cascade Books, September 2019. This is a book that should be read by anyone perplexed or frustrated by Christian support a president Trump, or who cares about the climate crisis and the destruction of the world we know, or who cares about the relationship between religion and politics and how it matters to us. It is a book about thinking about the future. Delay traces 5 zones of opposition: future, knowledge, sexuality, reality and society. One of his core points is as simple as it is outrageous: the white evangelical wants to destroy the world. Though often uncomfortable to read because of its implications for white liberalism, is a profoundly important book for our time, and it is likely to have a profound influence among scholars, pundits, and the public for years to come.
