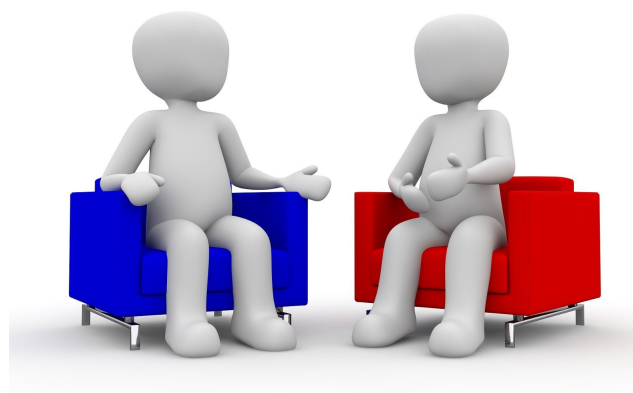
Men's Discussion Group meets on Tuesday, Jan. 8, at 6 p.m. at the Fellowship

We are encouraging NUUF members to attend this event. Advanced registration is required. Participation will be on a first-come, first-served basis. Participants must be at least 17 years old. Tamara Sharp and Barney Slowey, adjunct professors at Silver Lake College, will facilitate this interactive learning event. The poverty simulation is an exercise in empathy. You will experience what it is like to live with scarcity of resources, to have to make choices between paying for heat or food. You will learn about the constant pressures faced by those living in poverty. Register Now! So far, of our 80-plus membership, only 11 members of NUUF have registered. Eleven! Yikes! This is our signature community event. The Social Justice Committee (especially Diane) works very hard to bring this event to the Northwoods. Social Justice is one of the major reasons Unitarian Universalism exists. I certainly hope we will have better participation than eleven individuals, most of whom belong to the committee. It's one thing to give money to help those in need. That's great. But gaining empathy for those who struggle leads to more genuine engagement. In other words, it makes us better people.
- Propose Nominees from Your Congregation to UUA MidAmerica Region Boards and Committees by Jan. 7. The Nominating Committee of the MidAmerica Region

(MAR) of the Unitarian Universalist Association (UUA) seeks your help.

Unitarian-Universalists are committed to diverse volunteer leadership, and our committee is seeking candidates for the Regional Board and the Nominating Committee itself.

We seek to nominate individuals to reflect the full diversity of the Region, especially in regard to historically marginalized communities, but also balancing amongst size of congregation, lay and ordained, geography, age (including youth and young adults), and gender, among other characteristics. Members in good standing of one of the member congregations of the Region or CLF members residing within MAR geography are eligible to serve.

The Board of Trustees is responsible for governance between annual meetings of the member congregations. There are nine members serving three-year terms. The President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Members-at-Large are elected directly by delegates at the annual meeting.

The Nominating Committee has seven members serving two-year terms. This committee recruits volunteers to serve on MAR's Board of Trustees, Nominating Committee, Midwestern UU Conference board, and Camp UniStar Board.

Please ask your members and ministers, perhaps particularly your past General Assembly and MidAmerica Regional Assembly participants, as well as graduates of the Midwest Leadership School, if they will consider serving the MidAmerica Region of the UUA in any of these ways. We would appreciate your response before the holidays, but at least by January 7, so we can meet our deadline.
