Green Tips

Send old electronics to the “Boneyard”. It’s part of the modern dilemma: What do you do with that old cell phone or outdated computer? Instead of throwing them into the trash, send them to www.MyBoneYard.com. They are a licensed electronics recycler and guarantee to strip and permanently delete all personal information from your recycled product. It couldn’t be easier. Just register each product on their site and print a prepaid shipping label—they pay the shipping—for each item, then pack it up and send it off. They fret their hearts away, swayed by envy and greed.

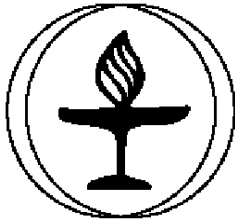
They ride roughshod in pursuit of their ends.
